# WHAT TO DO AFTER A CAR ACCIDENT

DOWNLOAD, PRINT & KEEP IN YOUR GLOVEBOX

#### SAFETY FIRST:

Move yourself and your car to a safe area away from oncoming traffic.

If necessary, CALL 911

### CHECKLIST:

## INFORMATION YOU NEED AT THE SCENE OF A CAR ACCIDENT

INFORMATION: Write down AND photograph	
	The other driver(s) name The other driver(s)' drivers license number Registration number Insurance Information Cell phone & email (test their cell by making a call on the scene) License plate state and numbers
PICTURES: Take photos of the damage to all cars involved	
	GENERAL: Take general photos of the entire scene, get as many angles as possible
	<b>TRAFFIC SIGNS:</b> Take photos of any "traffic indicators" (e.g. stop lights, yield signs, other road signs) and try to include the cars in the photo
	<b>UP CLOSE SHOTS:</b> Photograph all four sides of your vehicle any and all damage to it (e.g. broken lights, dents, deployed airbags, etc.) up close. Do this with all cars involved
	<b>STREET SIGNS:</b> Photograph the intersection or identifying street. If there is damage to any street signs or other public property, photograph that
	SKID MARKS: If you can see skid marks, photograph them from afar and up close
	DATE & TIME: Take a photo of someone else's phone home screen that has the date and time displayed
	WEATHER: Take a photo of the weather (e.g. clouds, rain, snow, where the sun is in the sky, etc.)
	<b>INJURIES:</b> Take detailed and graphic photos of any injuries you sustained, the other driver(s)/passenger(s). Continue to take photos of your own injuries over the coming days
IMPORTANT THINGS TO REMEMBER	
	<b>SEEK MEDICAL ATTENTION:</b> Adrenaline from a crash can mask serious injuries for hours. If you're hurt, or suspect you might be hurt, have someone take you to the hospital or an urgent care center RIGHT AWAY.
	<b>DON'T APOLOGIZE:</b> Be careful to not use phrases such as "I feel fine," don't apologize or accept responsibility. There are many factors that can cause a car accident and you will almost certainly not know all of them at the time of the crash.
	<b>ONLY DISCUSS ACCIDENT DETAILS WITH AUTHORITIES:</b> Limit your discussion of the accident with the other party or parties involved. Only discuss details with the responding police officer or other authorities.
	<b>SEEK AN ATTORNEY:</b> In order to understand all of your options, seek out a personal injury attorney sooner rather than later. Consultations are typically free and most firms will only take a fee if they win the case for you.
